We have a change of format for the Spring 2019 NSW Industry Day. The day will start with a presentation by The Cavalcade of History and Fashion. Following this there is a choice of 4 workshops for each of the morning and afternoon sessions.



The Cavalcade of History and Fashion “The Art of the Cut: 1930s Evening Gowns”

The 1930s was a decade of glamorous and elegant evening wear in which classical draping, the bias cut and soft lustrous fabrics accentuated the body contours and silhouette. Fashion designers dressed Hollywood legends in romantic concoctions.

The Cavalcade’s collection of 1930s gowns and accessories will similarly delight audiences as history comes alive through the stories of the women who wore these gowns.

Throughout the presentation items are carried amongst the audience allowing a closer look at these treasures from the collection.

The Cavalcade of History and Fashion is an organisation with a collection of original historic gowns and accessories with provenance, dating from the 1700s preserving Australia’s social and fashion history.

1. Lorraine Jenkins – Toile Fittings

Bring along a project toile and get some expert advice. Doing a toile fitting is a good idea to see where adjustments need to be made on a live body. Bring the pattern and after the fit Lorraine can show how to make the adjustments.

This workshop is limited to 10 participants (5 for the morning session, and 5 for the afternoon session), with 1 garment per person. Lorraine will email a requirements list.
